- 1621 Plymouth d. **John Tilley**. [TAG 52:203]
- 1621 Plymouth d. **Joan Tilley** wife of John Tilley. [TAG 52:203]
- 1621 Plymouth d. **Jasper Moore**, boy with the John Carver family and John Carver's servant **Roger Wilder** [Bradford 443]
- April 1621, **John Carver** died. His wife **Kathrine** died 5 to 6 weeks after him. [Bradford86]
- June 1621 **John Howland** became head of the Carver household which included Elizabeth Tilley, Desire Minter, a boy William Latham, and a maid servant. [Bradford 441]
- 26 Apr 1623 m. Fenstanton **Margaret Howland** and **Richard Phillips**.
[HQ Volume 81 NO 1:16]
- By Abt. 1624 m. Plymouth **John Howland** and **Elizabeth Tilley** [PM 282]
"John Howland married the daughter of John Tilley, Elizabeth" [Bradford 444]
- Say 1624 b. Plymouth **Desire Howland** dau. John and Elizabeth Howland. [PM 282]
- 24 Feb 1626/7 b. Plymouth **John Howland** son of John and Elizabeth Howland. [Sewall 463]
- Say 1629 b. Plymouth **Hope Howland** dau. of John and Elizabeth Howland. [PM 282]
- 31 Jul 1629 Buried Fenstanton **Margaret Howland** [HQ Volume 81 NO 1: 10]

- 6 Sep 1620 Mayflower Sailed from Plymouth, England. [MOURT 157]
- Fall 1620 John Howland fell overboard and was hauled a board the Mayflower. [Bradford 59]
- 11 Nov 1620 John and Elizabeth arrive at Provincetown after 66 days at sea [NEHGR 70:339/42] [Mourt 2]
- 11 Nov 1620 John signs the Mayflower Compact at Provincetown. [NM 38] [MOURT 3]
- 1 Dec 1620 Humphrey Howland completed draper apprenticeship in London. [HQ Volume 81 NO 1: 14] [Drapers]
- 6 Dec 1620 John Howland as one of the 10 principal men set out in the shallop to explore Cape Cod Bay. [Bradford 68 Note 7] [MOURT 15]
- 8 Dec 1620 Shallop arrived at Clark's Island. [MOURT 58-59]
- 10 Dec 1620 Kept the Sabbath on Clark's Island. [MOURT 158]
- 11 Dec 1620 Shallop arrived at Plymouth exploring land and streams. [MOURT 59]

- 16 Dec 1620 Mayflower arrived in Plymouth Harbor. [MOURT 60]
- 19 Mar 1622/23 Simon Howland was apprenticed to Humphrey Howland (Master) Father Henry Howland yeoman of Fenny Stanton. [TAG 14:214] [Drapers]
- 1 Oct 1623 Henry Howland was apprenticed to Humphrey Howland (cloth worker, Thames St. London). Father Henry Howland yeoman of Fenny Stanton. [TAG 14:214] [Drapers]
- 1 Dec 1623 Humphry Howland completed apprenticeship. [TAG 14:214]
- 15 Mar 1625/6 Stephen Fisher apprenticed to Humphrey Howland (cloth worker, Bush Lane, London. [Drapers]
- 22 May 1627 In the division of livestock the Howland Family (4) & 9 others received one heifer named Raghone (lot 4). [PCR 12:10] [PCRD V1:50]. [NM 382]
- Jul 1627 John Howland is one of the 8 Undertakers that signs the Articles of Agreement to pay the debts of Plymouth Colony etc. [Bradford 195 Note 5]
- 3 Jan 1627/8 John Howland & 5 others named to layout the lots for the 2nd land division. [PCR 11:4/5] [PCR 12:1 3/14]
- 24 Mar 1629 Simon Howland completed apprenticeship. [TAG14:214]

~ Land Transfers ~

- 1621 John Howland's Homestead on Northside of Leyden Street (Great Street) and Stephen Hopkin's lot location defined in Edward Gray deed to Rev. John Cotton 9 May 1670. [PCLR 3 (1b) 166] [PCRD V3 P1:166]
- 1623 John Howland granted four acres of land on South side of brook (Watson's Hill) Plymouth. [PCR 12:4] [PCRD V1:4]
- 3 Jan 1627/8 John Howland and five other men named to layout the land grants of the 2nd division of land. [PCRD V1:60] [PCRD V1:60]
- 1627 Grant to Howland Family of 80 Acres in Duxbury bordering Island Creek (not recorded.) See sale to Mr. Kempe [PCLR V1:93] [PCR 12:56] [PCRD V1:93]
