- 26 Dec 1638 Lt. William Holmes sold John Howland 33 acres in Duxbury. [PCLR 1:60] [PCRDV1:60]
- 26 Dec 1638 John Howland exchanges 33 acres in Duxbury for 23 acres at the Jones Riverbridge (Kingston) with Joseph Rogers. [PCR Vol. 12:135/6] [PCRD V1:222]
