Community

- 20 Apr 1690 Plymouth Church elder charge Joseph Howland with excessive drinking. [PChR 1:269]
- 18 Sep 1691 John Murdo vs Capt. Joseph Howland case over non-payment in shingles and boards. [PCCR 1:23]
- Sep 1692 Sarah Howland fined for fornication. [PCCR 6:80-81]
- 6 Mar 1694/5 Joseph Howland allowed passage to highway through lands of Cook and Gray. [PTR 1:235]
- 19 Mar 1694/5 Indenture signed by Joseph Howland, John Gray and Caleb Cook on fencing and the layout of Howlands Way to the common road. [PTR 1:242]
- 10 Jun 1695 Joseph Howland appointed to committee to regulate use of town commons. [PTR 1:237]
- 21 Mar 1698/99 Sarah Howland fined for fornication. [PCCR 6:147-148]

Land Transfers

- 17 Jul 1694 Capt. Joseph Howland and Elizabeth sold 4 acres of marsh land near Smelt brook to John Gray. [PCRD 1:277]
- 19 Mar 1694/5 Indenture between John Gray, Caleb Cook an Capt. Joseph Howland for a cart path to the common road from his house. [PTR 1:242/3]
- 25 Mar 1694/5 Joseph Howland sold 4 acres of marsh near Sever brook to Nathaniel Southworth. [PCRD 10:552]

- 9 Dec 1696 Joseph and Elizabeth Howland gave ½ acre of land in Plymouth to son Thomas Howland. [PCRD 2:76]
- 25 Mar 1697/8 Joseph and Elizabeth Howland gave a parcel of land in Plymouth to son Thomas Howland. [PCRD 2:77]
- 28 Mar 1698 Joseph and Elizabeth Howland sold 1 acre of marsh at Howlands Point to John Bradford [PCRD 12:42]
- 26 May 1698 Joseph, Elizabeth and Thomas Howland sell land inherited from Capt. Southworth at Winnetuxet River (Plympton) to George Samson. [PCRD 9:322]
- 28 Dec 1698 Capt. Joseph and Elizabeth Howland sold 1 acre of marsh below the Jones River bridge at Howlands Point to John Bradford. [PCRD 4:62]
- 20 Dec 1699 Capt. Joseph and Elizabeth sold 40 acres at Colchester (Plympton) to Elkanah Cushman [PCRD 3:164]
